I had went on a string of HBCU college tours with my best friend and my sister. On a Monday, I toured Howard University in DC & I had my heart set on being at the Mecca! I had already loved the city, but I still wanted to tour A&T so that Wednesday I took the tour. As soon as I stepped on campus I knew this is where I wanted to be, the atmosphere was so friendly and I had felt like an Aggie that day! I applied as soon as I got back to Virginia the next day! I got deferred because I sent the wrong test scores, but I didn't realize that until I bawled my eyes out LOL. I sent the right test scores and the next week I received my acceptance letter and that letter gave me the "OK" to wear and buy all the Aggie gear I wanted to! I couldn't wait to attend the #1 Public HBCU in the country, of course I was scared because I'd be going to a school 4 hours away from what I know, but I wasn't going to let that stop me from experiencing life as an Aggie & the rest is history...in the making!

4. "First time" experiences at your HBCU?*

One of my favorite "first time" experiences was when I went to my first football game as a college student! My freshman year I went to the homecoming game and here at A&T homecoming is called GHOE (Greatest Homecoming on Earth) and that experience was more than I expected it to

be! To be in the presence of alumni and students who love their school so much gave me chills because I realized now I'm a part of something bigger than myself! I love being an Aggie...we brag different!

5. Who are the professors that have impacted your life in and out of the classroom? How did they do that?*

My English 100 professor Ms. Adri-Anne Jones impacted me the most! One day during the first semester of my collegiate career, I was so stressed my grannie had passed two weeks before freshman move-in day, I was confused as to what I wanted to do with my life and I went to see Ms. Jones about a grade and I ended up telling her everything going on with tears streaming down my face and ever since then when I see her I talk to her about all the good that has happened!
